






WADDUP DOE DETROIT

Our current goal is to create 200 sleeping bags for nomadic and displaced individuals sleeping outside ASAP! If you'd like to help us get to that goal, let us know. Here are some ways to get involved:

- Come into the office (22400 W 7 Mile Rd., Detroit, MI 48219) to either process donations OR create sleeping bags
 - For everyone's safety, masks are required at all times inside the building. There are also separate rooms to accommodate for social distancing.
 - Sign up for a time to volunteer here.
- Volunteer from home by purchasing a \$25 <u>supply kit</u> to be shipped directly to you
 - You will need tape, scissors, and an iron to create sleeping bags
